## 4. Report from Dean of Academic Affairs Greg Ochoa

- 6. Faculty Representative Reports
  - a. WVU Senate (Vik Frazier, Caitlin Hudgins, Heidi Samuels)

Senate met on February 14th.

Graduation rate up 10%, to 63%, over 5 years system-wide. Incoming freshmen retention is at 81%. Rob Alsop reported that WVU representatives met with Senator Rutger, the sponsor of SB 498, which would prohibit certain ideas around race from being taught in the classroom, including that one race is superior/inferior to another. WVU emphasized that we do not indoctrinate, but we do challenge our students.

Assoc. Provost Widders provided an update on Student Success and Academic Advising Transformation. He highlighted recent student success wins (redesigned suspension policy, Guided Pathways improves retention with more choices, priority scheduling reform, tutoring centers' increased data collection and newly implemented trainings) before focusing on the need to close access gaps by improving advising. WVU plans to transition to pro-active, data-driven, resource-intensive modes of advising.

- HEPC now requires a "course cost marking system" effective fall 2022.
- Instructional materials' cost as a course feature attribute.
- Cost transparency is the goal.
- Courses will be identified as:
  - o No Cost
  - Low cost which indicates courses where books and course required materials are under \$75.
  - O.E.R open educational resources

- V. Frazier adds: work on improving research, also HEPC requires a course cost marking system
- b. WVU Senate Executive Committee (Sheri Chisholm)
   Academic Transformation has been a major focus in exec this year. Good success and retention rates are tied to advising, so WVU as a whole is looking to expand professional advising staffing and training.
   This is a good time for us to redefine advising on our campus.
- ACF Report (Tom Sydow)
   Great Teachers flyer has been emailed. Conference (June) focuses on art of teaching, not subject matter.
   We have two seats.
