3. Report from Campus President Jennifer Orlikoff

Diversity issues on campus: racial slurs in men's bathrooms, Gay/Straight alliance flyers being pulled down or covered by Campus Crusade for Christ. We need a solution. Will be discussed further in New Business

Q G. Wilcox: Booster vaccines? A V. Frazier: They will be available through nursing dept, contact April. Pfizer available, Moderna is coming. J. Badenhoop: approval coming today, can get booster other than initial type.

4. Report from Dean of Academic Affairs Greg Ochoa

Faculty hiring approval- Geology, Biology, CIS, CJ, Business, Surgical Tech coordination, waiver for Math (Lisa Zyga, was previously a national search), Library Director, Title III director (will then start searches for others) Spanish will remain visiting, English is being held for Spring enrollment numbers. It was technically a replacement position but enrollment has changed since then. Will have ENG faculty teaching communication and WGST, which should be positive for numbers.

Creating a workgroup for review of journalism

Travel requests- faculty will be contacted soon. Second round coming since there is more money available. Early alerts: currently week 2 and 5. Changes for Spring: week 3-4, midterm, week 12. Adding one this semester in week 12.

- Q S. Chisholm: With Title III, do you foresee changes for advising? Other reorganization? A: Not sure yet. We'll be creative and flexible. Hope to have more conversation with faculty. Perhaps: professional advisors might take over general studies advising, at least for the first year.
- Q: H Samuels: Can we publish the grant somewhere? A: Maybe listserv or N drive.
- Q: M. Martini: What does the assessment director assess? Same as now or different? A: Not sure yet, but since it's full time 12 mo, should probably replace our current role. Evaluation of courses, programs, etc.
- Q: V. Frazier: What is the goal? Over 5 years? What about when it ends? A: Part of accepting this is that we take over paying for it in a structured manner, can reapply. We should be able to afford it if we grow enrollment and retention as planned through the grant.
- Q T. Sydow: Do we need full searches? A. Yes.
- Q H. Samuels: Academic Transformation: What is going on with degrees that are being combined at Morgantown, but we have an AA here? CAC took a big hit. Are we on top of this? A: SIP lists are being reviewed.
- Q J. Badenhoop: Academic Success progress check? A: Interviewed for science tutor and mixed tutor/advisor positions, but little interest after salary is discussed. Little interest for peer tutors, either. Dedicated to getting staff, however.
