- 2. Professor Samuels moved for the approval of the minutes from the February 24, 2017, Faculty Assembly meeting (*Annex 1*). <u>Motion Carried</u>.
- 3. Campus President Orlikoff reported the following:
 - John Campbell has forwarded documents regarding the budget situation and Higher Education in West Virginia. Please review them. (*Annex 6a and 6b*).
 - WVU Day at the Legislature is Tuesday 27 March 2017.
 - There is an increased enrollment push particularly for students with high GPAs who are out of state or out of Metro area.

- At a recent retreat with the Marketing Department it was discussed that they are the heart of communication for the campus. Every effort should be made to have all publications (pamphlets, stickers, fliers, etc.) go through the department so that we have a similar look moving forward.
- President Gee gave his State of the University Address was last Wednesday. Excellent speech and the text of the speech is available (<u>http://presidentgee.wvu.edu/speeches/2017-state-of-the-university-address</u>)
 - He touched on the need for higher education in regards for job growth.
 - Spoke about the core values of the WVU system
 - Service oriented
 - Curious
 - Respectful
 - Accountable
 - Appreciative
- Adding to those goals, President Orlikoff's campus specific goals are
 - o Increase enrollment
 - Increase retention
 - Create united positive welcoming campus and community
 - Foster culture of proactive planning
 - Culture of quality in academics, athletics and facilities
- We will now have a Title IX investigator here on campus, Kara Anderson. This will help better serve our students.
- 4. Academic Dean's Report given by Associate Dean Douhitt
 - Thanks for those who participated in Coordinator for Institutional Effectiveness search process. Currently in the offer/negotiation stage and an announcement will be made soon.
 - Priority registration has begun. General registration starts next Tuesday, 28 March.
 - 1st PSO is on April 10. The morning presentations will be shortened so prospective students will be released for testing or registration early, at 9:30.
 - Placement Testing
 - English placement testing remains the same
 - Math will be done through ALEKS same as Morgantown, same cutoffs
 - To expedite the system, when prospective students leave computer labs, they will have a printout of ALEKS scores. When they enter the band room, Jayne will assign a math course based on the student's major and placement score. The student will then proceed to a faculty member for registration.
 - ALEKS system
 - Once a student is registered, they will have 12 months of free access to the program to help prepare
 - Only proctored exams will be valid placement scores
 - After 1st proctor test cannot retest until you complete remediation modules
 - Starts for Fall 2017. We will continue to use Accuplacer for Summer 2017 courses (Math 93)
 - Graduation applications
 - Student needs to meet with you and bring the application by to fill out the graduation survey
 - Reviewing applications that come in students may participate if they have a 1.95 GPA and within 6 credits of what they require. Should be enrolled in those credits already. Don't fill out application until they are close to meeting requirements
