#### c. Scott McVicker, finance

How are we doing? S. McVicker started in July 2020 when people were on furlough and we reopened with various restrictions. But-shutdown actually saved us some money.

Chart of cash balances dwindling, well into the red. However, rate of loss is decreasing.

Fall 2022 looks optimistic with revenue pickup, however, costs will increase, too.

Revenue ~ \$12 million, Costs ~ \$14 million. Remember- we are part of the \$1.1 billion entity.

- Q: J. Badenhoop: How is fundraising? A: Target was one million last year, and we came within a few thousand of the mark. Unsure about this year yet.
- Q: M. Saifi: How did the cash balance change so drastically? Where did we lose money? A: Students peaked, we paid off a dorm, bought some properties (thinking things would continue to go up). However, enrollment went down, and new building costs remained.
- Q: M. Saifi: What is the best solution? A: We need to generate more money and be judicious in spending. However, austerity budgets don't solve a deficit. Instead: strategic moves needed. We're looking for multiple small solutions, not a single \$12 million solution.
- Q: M. Martini: But we aren't a household budget. What about state and federal appropriations? A: He is confused, it's all based on relationships. There will be a new formula, and hopefully it will help, but it's all up in the air. Maybe hire a government relations person. Our appropriations have stayed at \$4.5 million since 1999.
- Q: C. Hudgins: So we won't get what the governor promised? A: It's based on the average state employee salary. So- 5% of \$50k, but complicated by the fact that we're not fully state funded. So it has to be prorated. Timeframe: over the summer, see it in August.
- Q: H. Samuels: entitled to raises? A: It will be tied to performance and COMPA ratio. How do we get this info? We'll be working through it... (A: G. Ochoa- A. Morgan in HR will sit down with us to review)
- Q: N. Gardner: Will this ensure that staff at making \$15/hr? A: Not necessarily. University is committed to the idea that we should pay enough that staff are not on benefits. With understanding of benefits cliffs. Are we compared to only WV or Cumberland metro? A: Good question, talk to A. Morgan.
- Q: V. Frazier: How to deal with promotions? A: Unsure. Ask A. Morgan.
