This is the first time a policy has existed regarding grants. Faculty are not required to follow this policy, but Mr. Letrent offered his assistance through the process.
- The Title III grant is in year 2. There is a new grant to be submitted to encourage rural high school students to pursue college education. In addition, there will be a proposal for Student Support Services, which formally existed successfully at PSC.
